The day runs from 9.30 or 10:20 to around 5.00pm. Each day will include 4 subject tutorials and 3 exam paper practice sessions, which are assessed by the tutors.

Autumn 2009 Half Term – General Information

Location

The half-term revision courses will take place at:

Oxford International College, 39-42 Hythe Bridge Street, Oxford OX1 2EP

The College is less than 5 minutes walk from both Oxford railway and coach stations.

Dates

Nine separate one-day courses are available between Saturday 24th October and Sunday 1st November, 2009

Course availability

All subjects are available. A-level students may select one AS or A2 module per day from any subject. GCSE and IB students may select on subject per day.

Due to the limited availability of classrooms during this period, places are strictly limited and early booking is advisable. If for any reason we are unable to offer your chosen module or subject, we will telephone you as soon as possible on receiving your application form. In this event you will be offered an alternative course or a full refund of fees.

Exam boards

All exam boards are offered (AQA, Edexcel, OCR, WJEC and IBO).

A-level courses (AS and A2) are module specific and almost all are board specific. Occasionally, where two exam boards cover the same topics for a specific module (e.g. Maths C1) a group may be mixed. In such cases we guarantee that every topic covered on the revision course will be specific to all boards represented.

All GCSE courses are tier specific (i.e. higher, intermediate or foundation). We do not guarantee that all GCSE courses will be board specific, as most exam boards cover the same core topics at each tier. We do guarantee that every topic covered on the revision course will be specific to all boards represented.

All IB courses are level specific (i.e. higher or standard).

Course structure

We normally operate two timetables each day:

Timetable 'A' begins at 9.30am and ends at 4.30pm

Timetable 'B' begins at 10.20am and ends at 5.20pm

When we confirm your booking you will be notified of your timetable.

Each day will include 4 tutorials and 3 past exam paper study sessions, reviewed by the tutors.

We reserve the right to alter the timetable if required, in which case the total contact time with the tutors will not be reduced.

Class size

The maximum class size is 4. Owing to the diversity of exam boards and options this maximum size rarely occurs. The average class size from previous half-term courses is 1.5. Many students will receive individual tuition, for which no additional fees are charged.

Overnight accommodation

The half-term courses are *non-residential*. For students attending two or more consecutive days who wish to remain in Oxford overnight, we will send you an accommodation list including local B&Bs, hotels and hostels (see application form on reverse).

Meals and refreshments

Lunch is not provided. Students may bring their own lunch for consumption in the College common room, or there are numerous sandwich bars and fast food restaurants within a few minutes walk. Tea and coffee making facilities are available for student use at the College all day free of charge.

Included in each day's timetable is a 40-minute lunch break, a 10 minute morning coffee break and a 10 minute afternoon tea break.

Arrival instructions

We will send you full arrival details, including a map, what to bring, accommodation list if required, etc, once we have received your completed application form.
